Summary of Meeting Outcomes:

Action 1: Re: meeting Places. Steve and H.T. to take proportions of snapping turtle, scale down the Turtle, and redesign the concept; from which more detailed designs can be created in 2014.

Action 2: Re: meeting Places. Sheri to review the past materials to suggest what message the sign at the Bear would communicate.

Action 3: Re: Coordinator Report. Sheri to review procurement policies, and from the materials begin to draft a brief procurement document for the Board

1. Opening and Introductions – Chief Bomberry opened the meeting

2. Agenda Review

 Agenda accepted with a change to Item 4 – presentation from Ken Coit to highlight Art in Public Places (and not Trail Markers as outlined on the Agenda)

3. Meeting Place Presentation (See PowerPoint Presentation provide by H.T. Lam)

- Steve Barnhart, Landscape Architectural Services, COH
- H.T. Lam, Landscape Architect, COH
- Steve provided background context and H.T. delivered the presentation including updates on the Bear Meeting Place construction
- Board discussion around:
 - o Challenges, opportunities, estimated costs and status of each
 - The Eel which still requires surveying and grading design, would require the least amount of design work relative to the Nest and Turtle which are still very conceptual
 - Priority for the next meeting place is on detailed design
 - Location of Turtle feature The City recommended the location be shifted from the lower site to the top of the reclaimed landfill for several reasons including drainage
 - Scale of Turtle concept The City highlighted the size of the proposed turtle (over 40 m) and recommended the scale be considered (scale down)
 - Type of turtle design Brian noted that the Snapping Turtle is the type of turtle significant to the Haudenosaunee and should be used for the design and sign logo
 - Signage for the Bear Sheri suggested a sign to give some description for the Bear and a link (or QR code) to the JSB web site to guide people to more information.
 - Challenges with signage in public places
 - Discussions on signage with past JSB led to considerations for a simple upright marker to reduce potential for vandalism, cost effective, and natural look
 - Ken shared experiences with different signs use for Art in Public projects that could be considered as more subtle forms of signage to match the intent of the Bear
 - To seek funding for constructions its important detailed designs be completed to submit quickly to funding opportunities when they emerge

4. Art in Public Places Presentation

- The Board received overview of the Art in Public Places program
- Ken Coit, the City of Hamilton, Coordinator delivered a presentation highlighting the program and process for public art projects including examples pieces throughout the City
- Highlights included the range of art pieces completed, process for public participation, decision-making, and types of art work that might be applicable to the valley trails or within the Environmental Interpretive Centre
