## 4.2 Turtle Design

- Sheri provided an update on past Turtle Meeting Place activities, timelines and decision-making
- Andrew provide an update on the process and steps taken to engage a consultant from the approved city roster, and the rational to have completed a shovel ready project
- MMM Group identified for their experience in landfill projects
- Sheri shared details about the MMM Group proposal and agreement for \$22,200 signed in November 2014
- \$22,200 that includes three parts, and two approval meetings with the board during Part A and Part B
  - Part A Conceptual Design March 2015 completion
  - Part B Detailed Design Services June 2015 completion
  - Part C Tender Stage September 2015 completion
- Discussion on other considerations related to the Turtle included notifying Hamilton Conservation Authority, and checking with the Ministry of Transportation regarding features and distance from highway
- The detailed design should be finalized by June 2015 in time for 2016 capital budget planning
- The board was shown aerial images of the landfill as the location for the landfill - and suggested that the turtle be layered on to the image

### 4.3 Environmental Interpretive Centre
